Pictures of Roly's words Parent/teacher notes

BEFORE YOU BEGIN TO PLAY ROLY'S MODULE 1 AND 2 VIDEOS

- 1 Before you play, have the child hold their Roly-ball and say, "These are pictures of Roly's words."
- 2 Point to the picture of the boy with the Sam nametag and say, "His name is Sam."
- 3 Name the items in the picture and invite the child to point to pictures one by one as you say them—sun, mat, man, sat, mum, and who is Sam. Say the words normally as a whole word, not with Roly's fragmented language from the Play Roly song.

When the child points to the correct picture, they are showing you that they know the meaning of each word—this is needed for Play Roly. If the child doesn't point to the correct word, show them again and repeat the word (Sam for the boy).

- 4 High-five after this step.
- 5 Repeat this step each time before Play Roly until the child can easily and accurately point to the picture for all six of Roly's words—sun, mat, man, sat, mum, and Sam.

WHEN YOU PLAY ROLY'S MODULE 1 AND 2 VIDEOS

- 1 When the video prompts, ask the child to point to the picture to tell you what Roly is saying.
- 2 After the second prompt, if the child doesn't know, say the word and point to the correct picture to show them the word Roly said in his fragmented language. For example, if Roly's three sounds were ssss-uuu-nnn, say "sun" and point to the picture of the sun.
- 3 High-five at the end of each video.
